- 9. In the 19th Century, the Phoenix Iron Company was the largest single employer in all of Chester County.
- 10.Phoenixville is the site of one of the oldest surviving houses (built before the Revolutionary War) in Chester County.
- 11. Among the major bridges built by the Phoenix Bridge Company was the Brooklyn Bridge.
- 12. Phoenixville area land was originally part of a land grant from William Penn.
- 13. Before 1890, the two tallest bridges in the United States had been built by the Phoenix Bridge company, a division of the Phoenix Iron Company.
- 14. The oldest monument in Phoenixville is the Revolutionary War Monument located at Bridge Street and Nutt Road.
- 15. Phoenixville fielded one of the earliest professional football teams in the United States.
- 16.**BONUS QUESTION**: Phoenixville has more streets named after Presidents of the United States than any other community in Chester County.
